The Electronic Technology Committee of the UWRA, like other committees, totally altered its modus operandi in the face of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Until then, the committee, co-chaired by Kathy Christoph and Louise Robbins, met monthly and planned and carried out two types of activities: Programs—lectures by guest speakers followed by questions and answers; and Tech Clinics (formerly known as Getting IT Done)—informal sessions held following business meetings and generally led by members of the committee.

In addition, various members of the committee occasionally write articles for *The Sifter* and respond to a special email address with answers to questions.

Activities are usually well-attended and well-received. 2019-20 programs included “What kinds of computing devices should I be using?”; “Google Tools”; “Sightings and Sounds of Nature Apps.” Tech clinics have focused on “Cutting the Cord—Streaming TV”; “Google Photos 2”; and “What Are Podcasts and Why Should I Care?”

Kathy Christoph will continue as co-chair, to be joined by Ann Wallace as assistant chair; new members of the committee are Bruno Browning and Faisal Kaud.
