Dane County's Caregiver Program, referred to as *Caring for Caregivers*, recognizes the critical role of families and friends in providing care to older adult family members, friends, and neighbors; and the role of older adults in raising grandchildren and caring for severely disabled adult children or relatives ages 18—59. Programs and services support and guide caregivers in their efforts to help their loved ones live at home as long as possible while caring for themselves in the process.

Funded by the National Family Caregiver Support Program (NFCSP), the Older Americans Act, and Dane County, it provides help to those caring for:

- persons age 60 and older, or
- persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders regardless of age, or
- children (under age 18) being raised by their grandparents or other relatives (age 55+), or
- disabled adults (age 18–59) receiving care from their parents, grandparents, or other relatives (age 55+)


